

# **Overview of Community Resources - New York**

This introduction to community resources in New York can help you begin to understand options and to explore if you may be eligible.

#### **NY Connects**

Connects older adults and individuals with disabilities of any age to long term community supports and services.

Community Action Agencies can help to locate resources in your area. Programs can include food assistance, housing programs, and access to other community resources.

## At OTDA you may apply for:

- Temporary Assistance (TA)
   otda.nv.gov/programs/temporary-assistance/
  - Temporary cash assistance programs to assist individuals and families.
- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
  - otda.ny.gov/programs/snap/

Previously known as Food Stamps, SNAP funds may be used to buy food. Individuals and families with low income may qualify.

#### **Additional Cash Assistance**

- Paid Family Leave provides eligible employees job-protected, paid time off to:
  - o Care for a family member with a serious health condition.
  - Bond with a newborn child, adopted child, or foster care child (within 12 months' time).
  - Assist loved ones when a spouse, domestic partner, child or parent is deployed abroad on active military service.

- **Short Term Disability** provides cash-only benefits to eligible employees with an injury or illness not related to their job.

- The Social Security Administration (SSA) has two programs for people with serious disabilities. Find your local SSA office: <a href="mailto:secure.ssa.gov/ICON/main.jsp">secure.ssa.gov/ICON/main.jsp</a> or call 800-772-1213. We recommend you apply in person or on the phone if possible.
  - Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI): for those who have recently worked and paid Federal Insurance Contributions Act (FICA) taxes for at least a certain period of time before becoming disabled.
  - Supplemental Security Income (SSI): for those who are disabled, blind, or age
     65+. Needs-based program with income and asset limits.

#### **Food Assistance**

- **SNAP** See OTDA above for information about SNAP (formerly food stamps).
- The Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC)
  People with low-income may qualify if they are pregnant, breastfeeding, non
  breastfeeding postpartum, or a child up to their 5<sup>th</sup> birthday. No immigration
  requirements. To find and apply at your local WIC office go to:
