

Overview of Community Resources - Vermont

This introduction to community resources in Vermont can help you begin to understand some options and to explore further to see if you may be eligible.

Vermont Community Action Partnership

Community Action Agencies can help to locate resources in your area. Programs can include food assistance, housing programs, and access to other community resources.

Vermont Department for Children and Families (DCF)- Economic Services Division (ESD)

Case Management and cash assistance for low-income households with dependent children.

Essential Person

Cash Assistance for individuals with a disability that receive or have applied for SSI/SSDI benefits and have someone living with them to provide essential care. Payment provided to the individual with a disability.

• 3SquaresVT (also known as SNAP)

Previously known as Food Stamps, 3SquaresVT (SNAP) funds may be used to buy food. Individuals and families with low income may qualify.

Additional Cash Assistance

- The Social Security Administration (SSA) has two programs for people with serious disabilities. Find your local SSA office: secure.ssa.gov/ICON/main.jsp or call 800-772-1213. We recommend you apply in person if possible.
 - Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI): for those who have recently worked and paid Federal Insurance Contributions Act (FICA) taxes for at least a certain period of time.
 - Supplemental Security Income (SSI): for those who are disabled, blind, or age 65+.
 Needs-based program with income and asset limits.

Food Assistance

- **3SquaresVT (SNAP)** See ESD above for more information about **3SquaresVT** (formerly food stamps).
- The Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC):
 People with low-income may qualify if they are pregnant, breastfeeding, non-breastfeeding postpartum, or a child up to their 5th birthday. No immigration requirements. To find and apply at your local WIC office go to: healthvermont.gov/children-youth-families/wic/apply

A program that assists with temporary housing in emergency situations. If found eligible the program can assist with finding temporary housing in a hotel room.
