Funds for Greater Boston Residents

Jewish Family and Children's Services

Provides rent and utilities assistance to **residents of greater Boston**, regardless of religion or affiliation. 781-647-JFCS (5327)

The Lend a Hand Society

Provides one-time emergency grants for low-income residents of **greater Boston**. The SWAN Society – for elder single, divorced, or widowed women

You must be 65 or over and a single, divorced, or widowed woman and live within a **25-mile radius of Boston**. **A professional must apply on your behalf.** Call 617-918-7404 or see <u>swansocietyboston.org</u>. Application: swansocietyboston.org/individual-grants

Rogerson Communities Elder Assistance Fund – for Boston elders Grants for **very low-income Boston residents aged 62 or older (or 55 or older and disabled)**. For **one-time** extraordinary expenses. **A professional must write a letter of support.** Call 617-327-1503 and ask for Resident Services Coordinator Danaejah Buissereth.
