Understanding Your Child's New Autism Diagnosis and Next Steps

Monthly: 2nd Tuesday (January - December)

Time: 12:00pm - 1:00pm

Cost: Free

Receiving a new diagnosis can be a life changing experience for caregivers. This interactive workshop is geared toward caregivers of young children. It provides support and general education about autism spectrum disorder, the treatments available, and community services available to families.

Autism 101 - 6-Session Workshop for Parents of Newly Diagnosed Children

Monthly: Starts 1st Friday (Nov/Jan/March/May)

Time: 12:00pm - 1:30pm

Cost: Free

Autism 101 provides interactive lesson, question and answer sessions and the opportunity to connect with other families with newly diagnosed children with autism. If you've found yourself typing "my child diagnosed with autism" into the google search bar, this group will help address that 'now what' feeling that you may have been experiencing.

Behavior Management

Behavior Basics - A 3-Part Series

Designed for parents of children of all ages, this interactive workshop series helps caregivers understand the basic principles of behavior to better manage challenging behaviors at home. Discussion focuses on evidence-based applied behavior analysis (ABA) and applying this methodology to daily life. We recommend completing all 3 courses in sequence.

Part 1 - Intro to ABA

Quarterly: Tuesday (Nov/Feb/May/Aug)

Time: 12:00pm - 1:00pm

Cost: \$35

This introductory class provides an ABA process overview and covers important topics such as data collection, assessment, daily schedule, and proactive strategies. Workshop dates for each month will be confirmed upon registration.

Part 2 - Reinforcement and Limit Setting

Quarterly: Tuesday (Nov/Feb/May/Aug)

Time: 12:00pm - 1:00pm

Cost: \$35

In the second class, the topics of reinforcement, limit setting, and other behavioral interventions will be discussed. Workshop dates for each month will be confirmed upon registration.

Part 3 - Problem Solving ABA

Quarterly: Tuesday (Nov/Feb/May/Aug)

Time: 12:00pm - 1:00pm

Cost: \$35

The final class will focus on what to look for in an ABA program and what to do when your child is not making progress. Workshop dates for each month will be confirmed upon registration.

Safety at Home and in the Community

Quarterly: Tuesday (Sept/Dec/March/June)

Time: 12:00pm - 1:00pm

Cost: \$35

Challenging behaviors can lead to safety concerns for individuals with autism, their siblings, their parents, and community members. This workshop will focus on proactive strategies to address safety at home, in the car, and in the community. We will also discuss how to develop a safety plan to help manage crisis situations. Workshop dates for each month will be confirmed upon registration.

Support for Medical Care

Fear of Needles - Desensitization Techniques

Monthly: 3rd Monday (March and October)

Time: 12:00pm - 1:00pm

Cost: \$35

This workshop is designed to support individuals of all ages who are afraid of needles. Parents will learn desensitization techniques, a gradual approach used to reduce anxiety. Sessions will include information about desensitization for shots and medical procedures, behavioral strategies parents can utilize at home to prepare for a shot, and visual supports.

Pill Swallowing

Monthly: 4th Monday (March and October)

Time: 12:00pm - 1:00pm

Cost: \$35

This workshop is designed for children of all ages who have difficulty swallowing pills. Swallowing a pill is an important life skill that many people with ASD have challenges with due to anxiety and sensory sensitivities. In this workshop, parents will learn helpful strateges and practice methods to use when teaching their child to swallow a pill.

Transition Services

Transition to Adult Services

Monthly: 1st Friday (January - December) **Time:** 12:00pm - 1:00pm

Cost: \$35

This workshop provides an overview and discussion about transition to adult planning. This presentation is specifically designed for parents or caregivers of an adolescent who has autism spectrum disorder or a related developmental disability who would like to learn about important information, such as timelines, steps/tasks, services and resources.

Guardianship 101

Monthly: 1st and 3rd

Thursdays (Jan - Dec)

Time: 1:00pm - 2:00pm

Cost: \$35

There is much to learn about decision-making options and protections for your child when approaching young adulthood/turning 18. The concept and process of guardianship of an adult can be daunting. This workshop offers information about alternative protections, what guardianship is, the different types and paths to guardianship, as well as how to prepare for guardianship. Participants will be provided with resource materials and referrals to legal experts.

Guardianship 102

Monthly: 2nd and 4th Thursdays (Jan - Dec)

Time: 11:00am - 1:00pm

Cost: \$75

Completing the paperwork required by the court for guardianship of an adult can be overwhelming and time consuming. This workshop offers a group tutorial for family members and caregivers to review the required documentation. Discussion will include the process of filing and giving notice as well as what to expect when appearing at a court hearing. Participants will be provided with referrals to legal experts. This workshop can be provided as a private family coaching session by appointment at a cost of \$150 per family.

Guardianship 103

Monthly: 4th Wednesday

(Jan - Dec)

Time: 2:00pm - 3:00pm

Cost: \$35

Once you have successfully completed your guardianship appointment, one of the important duties for legal guardians in Massachusetts is reporting to the probate court. The initial Guardian Care Plan/Report is required within 60 days of the appointment, and then annually on the anniversary of the guardianship appointment. This workshop is a hands—on group tutorial to help family members and caregivers prepare the Guardian Care Plan/Report. (MPC 821) .

Guardianship 104

Monthly: 2nd Wednesday

(Jan - Dec)

Time: 2:00pm - 3:30pm

Cost: \$50

The process of pursuing a Rogers Guardianship adds extra paperwork and tasks to family members and caregivers who are already stressed and overwhelmed. This workshop provides an overview of the Rogers Guardianship responsibilities, including what is required by the court. This workshop is not intended to provide legal advice, simply an overview of the Rogers Guardianship process.
