

Clothing Resources

- American Friends Service Committee (1991 Massachusetts Ave, Cambridge) 617-661-6130. Material Aid Program provides a week's worth of clothing, household goods, survival supplies, and hygienic supplies on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9am – 3pm. They're located in the basement of Cambridge Friends Meeting. You may come once every three months. You need a referral from a social worker or advocate. Referral form: https://www.afsc.org/document/maap-referral-form. Call or e-mail (CHurd@afsc.org) to schedule an appointment. Photo ID is encouraged.
- Arlington Street Church's Friday Night Supper Program (351 Boylston St, Boston) 617-221-6402. Serves approximately 150 meals to people in need each week but also provides clothing donations to visitors who request them. Call ahead to confirm time.
- Cambridgeport Baptist Church (459 Putnam Ave., Cambridge) 617-576-6779. Clothing is available during Saturday food pantry hours (1st and 3rd Saturday, 9:00am 11:00 am). At 9:00am a lottery system is used for queuing. Gently used clothing in good condition for minimal cost of \$0.25 cents per item. Photo ID is required. Email: theharvestfoodpantry@gmail.com
- St. Francis House (39 Boylston Street, Boston) 617-542-4211. You must have a St. Francis guest membership and must schedule an appointment. Visit their Fresh Threads department on the second floor any day Monday through Friday between 9am-11am, to schedule an appointment in person. Photo ID is required. - St. John's Clothing Center (95 Pine Street, Attleboro) 508-222-8400. Offers free clothing on the second Tuesday of the month from 10:00-11:30 a.m. No proof of residency needed.
- Room to Grow (142 Berkeley Street, Floor 3, Boston) 617-859-4545. Serves low-income families from just before child's birth through age three. Families must be referred by a professional at a partner agency to receive services and baby items. Mass General is a partner agency.
- Survival Centers: provides clothing for men, women, and children. Massachusetts Centers:
 - Amherst (138 Sunderland Road): 413-549-3968. Free thrift store. You can receive one small bag every day the "store" is open. There are no eligibility requirements. Hours: Mondays, Tuesdays, and Fridays from 11am-3pm. Thursdays from 11am-7pm. Every third Saturday of the month from 9:30am-11:30am.http://amherstsurvival.org/
 - Northampton (265 Prospect Street): 413-586-6564. Clothing is for food pantry clients only. Must show proof of residency. Serves 18 communities within Hampshire County. Hours: Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays 11am-2pm, Tuesdays and Thursdays 4pm-7pm. <u>http://www.northamptonsurvival.org/</u>

 Indian Orchard/Springfield (240 Main Street): 413-543-3930. The Clothing and Household Goods Program is open to anyone having a tough time making ends meet. Purchase a paper bag for \$5.00, or a larger bag for \$7.00 and fill the bag with your selections (limit of one bag of children's clothing). This site also has a thrift shop. Hours: Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 9:30am to 3:15pm and Thursdays 9:30am to 4:45pm. Closed daily for lunch from 12pm – 1pm. http://www.communitysurvivalcenter.org/

Children's Clothing Exchange (1151 Massachusetts Avenue, Cambridge, in the basement of the Old Cambridge Baptist Church) 617-576-0039. Bring gently used children's clothing to exchange. Most clothes are for newborns up to 16 years, but there is a limited selection for other sizes as well. Open Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm. Professional Clothing

- Career Closet (105 Adams Street, Quincy) 617-773-6203. Provides business clothing to men and women who are entering the professional workforce. You need a referral and must have a job interview set up or already be employed. Preference is given to South Shore residents, but exceptions can be made. Call to schedule an appointment with Eileen Kelly at 617-773-6203 ext. 19. - Dress for Success (989 Commonwealth Avenue, Boston) 617-779-2177. Offers complete interview outfits for women seeking employment. You need a referral. Your advocate must call to refer and can then set up an appointment date to receive the clothing. Once the you get a job, you may come back for more professional outfits. - SolutionsWear (Roosevelt Towers Housing Complex, 391 Evereteze Way, Cambridge) 617-576-0039. Provides interview-appropriate clothing and accessories to homeless and lowincome men and women who are enrolled in area job training programs. \$25.00 per client fee, and you need a social service agency referral and appointment. http://solutionsatwork.org/our-programs/professional-clothing/

These Programs Require Referral from a Non-Mass General Partner Agency:

- Cradles to Crayons (155 North Beacon Street, Brighton) 617-779-4700. Serves lowincome Massachusetts children up to age 12. You must have a referral from a registered partner agency. - Second Chances (Cambridge/Somerville) 617-660-0280. Provides clothing, shoes, gift cards, and accessories to homeless and low-income people in Somerville and Cambridge.
