

Questions to Ask when Assessing Public Benefits Eligibility for Non-Citizens*

- 1. What is the current immigration status of the individual (or household members) who would like to apply for public benefits?
- 2. How many years/months have he/she had that status?
- 3. Are there any agencies that he/she is currently working with around immigration or public benefits?

*Never encourage immigrants to contact ICE (govt. immigration office), if they are unsure of their status. The CRC can help locate agencies that specialize in immigration issues.

Undocumented Immigrants:

- Parents can apply for public benefits on behalf of their U.S citizen or Legal Permanent Resident status children without any risk.
- Always advise applicants not to use false documents when applying for any type of benefit.
- **Do not encourage immigrants to contact ICE** (government immigration office) **if they are unsure of their status.** The CRC can help locate agencies that specialize in immigration issues.
