These figures were produced using the following calculation:

## Gross income to net income:

- (-) 20% of gross income: Allowed for ALL households
- (-) Standard deduction: Capped at \$164 for households of 1-3, \$174 for households of 4, \$204 for households of 5
- (-) Shelter deduction: Table A no shelter expenses claimed. Tables B and C math includes max shelter deduction of \$552
- (-) Child Care deduction: Table C math includes sample of either \$300 or \$600/month (no max limit on dependent care)
- = Net income after allowable deductions

## Maximum SNAP allotment for household size:

(-) Net income x 0.3 is subtracted from max SNAP allotment based on household size

= <u>SNAP monthly benefit</u> for household based on income and size
