

# **Counseling Services – Vermont**

Here are some tips to help you find counseling services near you.

### **First Steps**

- Contact your insurance. Check the back of your insurance card for a phone number for "mental or behavioral health" that you can call and ask for local providers in your network.
- If you have one, speak with your employer's Employee Assistance Program (EAP). They usually have a list of local therapists. Your EAP may also provide short-term counseling and help you identify any longer-term therapy needs.

#### In Vermont

- Call 211 Call 2-1-1 on your phone 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, or search for services on the web <u>vermont211.org</u>. 211 is staffed by trained specialists who quickly assess your needs and refer you to the help you need. 211 services are free, confidential, and available in many languages.
- Department of Mental Health The Department of Mental Health designates one
  Designated Agency (DA) in each area of the state to provide the Department's mental health
