How does the Boston Family Engagement Network support families?

The purpose of our work is to support families in their role as their child's first teacher by ensuring that all families with young children, especially those with the greatest educational need, experiencing multiple risk factors, and in hard to reach populations, are engaged in their child's healthy development through access to family support services, child development knowledge and school readiness resources that are essential to their success. Our services include:



• Referrals and access to information and programs like quality child care; housing assistance; developmental, vision and dental screenings, WIC, early intervention, fuel assistance and more! This

year alone, we have assisted over 6,000 families.

• **Promotion of the importance of early literacy** through literacy nights, and the Parent Child

Home Program. Over 2,000 families have participated in and benefited from these programs.



Parent-Child Home Program – a home visitor comes twice a week

- Supporting families in building social connections with other families and their children through parent-child playgroups, nurturing groups, family cafés and parent support groups.
