

# Addressing Barriers to Specialized Dental Care

UAR Symposium: October 27, 2022

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### **Problem Statement**

**Background:** At BWH Oral Medicine and Dentistry and MGH Orofacial Pain, our patient populations do not reflect the racial and ethnic diversity of our community.

Specifically,

At MGH Orofacial Pain: 81% White, 6% Hispanic, 6% Asian, and 3% Black

At BWH Oral Medicine: 78% White, 7% Hispanic, 5% Asian, and 5% Black

In Boston, the population is: 53% White, 20% Hispanic, 10% Asian, and 25% Black

**Aim:** Increase the proportion of Black and Hispanic patients at 2 MGB dental specialty clinics sites by 2% within one year of implementation.



# Year 1 Accomplishments - Overview

Fall 2021

 Educational outreach w/ lectures provided to Brookside Community Health Center & Southern Jamaica Plain Community Health Center

September 2021 Implementation of eConsult order available in Epic for both BWH
 Oral Medicine and MGH Orofacial Pain

February 2022

 Establishment of a monthly clinic at Brookside Community Health Center



### eConsult service

- Available in Epic under "Orders" as of 9/2021
- BWH Oral Medicine
  - Options for consultation: oral mass, oral ulcers, oral pain, oral lesions, and other
- MGH Orofacial Pain
  - Options for consultation: jaw pain, facial pain, limited mouth opening, jaw clicking and locking





# eConsult utilization (9/2021 - 10/2022)

## **BWH Oral Medicine**

37 eConsults (average: 3 per month)

15 eConsults (41%) from BWH CHCs

**Ethnicity**: 38% Hispanic 57% non-Hispanic, 5% Unknown

Race: 5% Black 68% White, 27% Unknown/ Other

## MGH Orofacial Pain

24 eConsults (average: 2 per month)

5 eConsults (21%) from MGH CHCs

**Ethnicity**: 8% Hispanic 67% non-Hispanic, 25% Unknown


Race: 13% Black 63% White, 25% Other/Unknown



# OM/OFP clinic at BCHC

- Implemented in February 2022
- Supervised by attending, Dr. Piam Vacharotayangul and an OM or OFP resident
- Only internal referrals from Brookside
- 24 <u>new</u> patients seen over 7 dates
  - 19 oral medicine patients
  - 5 orofacial pain patients
- Procedures included biopsies (n=6), and injections (n=2)


### **Diagnoses of New Patient Consults**






# Demographics at monthly clinic at BCHC

### **Racial Demographics**




### **Ethnic Demographics**







### Year 1 Accomplishments: clinical outcome at BWH Oral Medicine






### Year 1 Accomplishments: clinical outcome at MGH Orofacial Pain

• English: 93% (1395/1493)

• Unknown: 1% (14/1493)

#### MGH

• English: 94% (617/651)

• Non-English: 3% (19/651)

• Unknown: 2% (15/651)



# Year 1 Challenges

### **Challenges encountered:**

- eConsults:
  - "Inappropriate" use by non-CHCs
  - Higher utilization of BWH Oral Medicine than MGH Orofacial Pain among CHCs
- Clinic at Brookside:
  - Limited to internal referrals
  - Cost of oral appliances ("night guards")
  - Need for support for a permanent oral medicine/orofacial pain clinician to work at BCHC

### What steps did you take to address those challenges?

- eConsults typically answered despite source; are continuing to gain traction
- Critically assessed personnel needs and role of appliance therapy (and other expenses to patient)

### Did you have any lessons learned? What were they?

Power of relationships between CHC providers and patients

### Did the aim statement or goals change throughout the year? How so?

Identified primary language as an additional demographic marker of interest



# Looking Ahead: Plans for Year 2

### In response to your year 1 performance, how will you continue your project in year 2?

- Distribute satisfaction surveys for patients and providers
- Determine how to help patients whose medical insurance may not be accepted (for oral appliances, medications)
- Find support for a permanent clinician to provide services at Brookside

### What are some major goals in year 2?

- Provide materials on diagnosis and management of oral medicine and orofacial pain conditions at other community health centers (North End, Cambridge Heatlh Alliance, Charlestown, Chelsea, Revere) available in multiple languages
- Consider outreach to the broader community aside from patients who have their primary care at Brookside (e.g. Harvard School of Dental Medicine)
